#### 【第3問題】

次の英文を読み、あとの問1~問6に答えなさい。 (\*のついている単語や語句には本文のあとに〈注〉があります。)

①<u>Do you</u> [ ]? It is \*the International Space Station(ISS). The ISS flies around the earth. It is as large as a soccer field, and people can stay there for a long time. Seven astronauts are staying there right now, and they do many \*experiments. (1) How did people send such a large building into space?

In 1984, the USA \*called on some countries to build a large place to live in space. At that time, the project to build the ISS began. The following year, Japan, Canada, and some European countries decided to join the project. In 1993, Russia joined in and started to make the first \*module. The module was \*launched in 1998, and \*construction of the ISS started. In 2000, three astronauts went to the ISS and stayed there. About 40 times since then, people have launched up different parts and \*assembled them in space. In 2011, the ISS was completed. Japan helped a lot during the construction of the ISS. The country launched parts three times to build the experiment module "Kibo," and Japanese astronauts took part in those missions each time. "Kibo" was developed by Japanese people and built by Japanese astronauts.

(2) When you see the ISS on TV, you may think it is flying slowly, but it is actually moving very fast. It flies around the earth once in about 90 minutes. The ISS can sometimes be seen from the earth if the weather is good. ②Now even [ \_\_\_\_\_] to space if they have a lot of money. Thanks to the ISS, space has become more \*accessible to us. Since the ISS was built, about 250 astronauts from 19 countries have stayed there and have done more than 3,000 experiments.

However, the ISS will be 25 years old this year, and its body is getting old. (3) \*NASA said that it is going to stop using the ISS in 2030. NASA knows that the first module launched in 1998 is \*partially broken. Also, (4) it takes a lot of money to keep using the ISS. In the 2020s, some companies will build new space stations, and NASA hopes to use them. Then, what will happen to the ISS after it stopped working? It is going to fall into an area of the sea called "Point Nemo" in January 2031. There are no islands around the area, so people living on the earth will be safe when the ISS fall there. Many rockets have fallen there \*so far. The ISS will be used to study Mars for the next eight years until it stopped working.

Ayumi: Oops! I've \*blurted out my dream. Please don't tell our classmates about it. I haven't even told my parents yet because I'm sure that they will say, "We don't think you can sing well. We already know you will give up \*halfway through."

Lucy: Your parents will never say such things. I know you are good at singing. When I went to karaoke with you last month, I was moved to listen to your songs. I hope that more people will listen to them. Well, in my opinion, you, yourself, are the biggest dream killer. You are thinking negatively and trying to kill your own dream.

Ayumi: I never thought like that, but maybe (2) you're right.

Lucy: Also, you're the one who started talking about the homework. You really want someone to listen to your dream and support you, right? Believe in yourself and tell your parents about your dream. If they \*disagree, just sing in front of them. They will understand how you feel.
